

## A. CREATE AN ACCOUNT ON THE SCC WEBSITE

You must have an account on the Virginia State Corporation Commission (SCC) website to register your business.




## B. BEGIN THE REGISTRATION PROCESS

Once you're logged in, select "Online Services" from the top menu and click "New Businesses."





# B. BEGIN THE REGISTRATION PROCESS CONT'D



- SELECT Virginia Entity
- SELECT "Limited Liability Company".
- SELECT "Articles of Organization" for standards LLCs.

\*Professional LLCs are for people that for perform licensed professional services, such as lawyers, therapist, etc.



# C. COMPLETE YOUR ARTICLES OF ORGANIZATION

Your Articles of Organization is a document that will consist of basic information about your business, including:


- 1. Name of the business
- 2. Business email address and phone number
- 3. Name and address of the registered agent
- 4. Principal office address
- 5. Your Signature

The process for completing your Articles of Corporation online are broken down into <u>nine</u> steps...



## STEP 1: ENTITY SEARCH

First, you'll need to enter the proposed name for your LLC to see if the name is available. If you previously reserved a name, click "YES" and follow the steps.




Otherwise, click "No," type in the name of your LLC, and click "Check Availability."If your chosen name is available, you may proceed by clicking "Next."






### STEP 2: ENTITY INFORMATION



- ENTER your entity's email address and phone number.
- SELECT an Industry Code. This will likely be "0 General."
- SELECT how long your entity will last. Most people select "Perpetual," which means forever.



### STEP 3: REGISTERED AGENT




A Registered Agent is a person or company responsible for receiving documents on behalf of your LLC and passing them on to the appropriate person at the business. An owner can also be the registered agent.



#### STEP 4: PRINCIPAL OFFICE ADDRESS


The Principal Office Address is the primary physical address where the business and its essential documents will be located.





#### STEP 5: PRINCIPAL INFORMATION

This section is for choosing your LLC's management structure. However, you are <u>NOT REQUIRED</u> to make a selection here. Instead, you can include this information in the LLC's Operating Agreement (discussed later).



Manager-managed - the LLC is run by someone that is not an owner.


**Member-managed** - the LLC is run by its owner(s).





#### STEP 6: SUPPORTING DOCUMENTATION

THIS SECTION IS <u>NOT REQUIRED</u> but can be used to upload supporting documents.








#### STEP 7: SIGNATURE INFORMATION

Here is where you acknowledge and sign your Articles of Organization.







### STEP 8: REVIEW

You can review all the information you have entered on the review page.

\*\*Please make sure the information is accurate.\*\*

If everything looks good, click "Add to Shopping Cart."








### STEP 9: SHOPPING CART

The final step is for you to pay the required filing fee.








## **ESSENTIAL NEXT STEPS**
